Example answers

- 1 hearing loss – the total or partial inability to hear sounds
- 2 to be exposed to – to be brought into contact with sth. else, often with the implication that the contact will cause some kind of change
- 3 to monitor – to watch, to keep track of sth., to check
- 4 to distract so. – to take so.'s attention away from what that person is doing or should be doing
- 5 to blast – to explode or destroy sth.
- 6 noise burden – noise that may lead to difficulties, distress or illness
- 7 devastating effect – the destructive or damaging consequence of sth. on sth.
