- 3 thriller – a film that has an exciting story, often about solving a crime

- 5 romance movie – a film about a love affair
- 6 action movie – a film in which a lot of exciting things happen
- 7 comedy – a film that is intentionally funny either because of its characters or its plot
- 8 western movie – a film based on stories about life in the west of the US in the past
- 9 fantasy movie – a film which usually includes magic, supernatural events, mythology, folklore, or exotic fantasy worlds
- 10 animated movie – a film in which a series of drawings, computer graphics, or photographs of objects are used
- 11 biographical movie – a film that dramatises the life of a non-fictional person

- 2 to be released – to be shown to the public
- 3 box-office success – a very successful film or play that earns a lot of money
- 4 sleep patterns – a person's schedule of bedtime and wake-up time as well as nap behaviour
- 5 to snack – to eat small amounts of food between meals
- 6 to linger – to remain or stay on in a place longer than is usual or expected
- 7 streaming schedule – the time one is sitting in front of the TV watching or streaming movies
- 8 controversial – causing disagreement or discussion
